Art History Concentration

Information about the Major

The Art and Art History Program offers a supportive, hands-on environment through which students can pursue a **Bachelor of Arts – Major in Art (BA – Art)** with **concentrations in Art History, Graphic Design, and Studio and Digital Art**. BA – Art majors receive individualized attention from faculty committed to high-impact teaching and learning, professional training, and creative discovery.

In following a curriculum that blends current media and technology with the traditional arts, BA – Art majors develop a solid foundation in the principles of two-dimensional, three-dimensional, and digital design. Complementary courses in art history help students build upon their understanding of context, including the connections between art and culture.

Once BA – Art majors complete the foundation courses, they specialize in one of the three concentrations offered by the Art and Art History Program. In all three concentrations, students work on applied practice, research methods, and professional portfolios. Considering the importance of career-based training, BA – Art majors also expand professional skills by participating in internships, exhibitions, and lectures/workshops from professionals in the field. Our facilities include two state-of-the-art computer labs, spacious 2D and 3D studios (tailored for ceramics, drawing, mixed media, painting, printmaking, and sculpture), an outdoor sculpture studio with gas kilns, a well-equipped darkroom, a digital media lab, a graphic design studio, and three galleries.

After completing the capstone project, BA – Art majors graduate with career-ready portfolios and professional skills for careers in creative industries, gallery/museums, graphic design firms, education, and/or graduate school.
