## **Your Four Year Plan**

### Year One

Get acquainted with the English faculty. In the fall, complete the ENGL A245: Introduction to Professional Writing course. Complete the Composition sequence (ENGL A101 and ENGL A102), work on General Education requirements, and take a 200-level ENGL course that does not have prerequisites. Join a club or organization. Get involved with the campus community.

## Year Two

In the fall, complete at least one lower-division Survey Requirement (for example, ENGL A284 or ENGL A288), and begin taking upper-division writing workshops (such as ENGL A345: Business Writing). In the spring, complete at least one more lower-division Survey Requirement (for example, ENGL A285 or ENGL A289), and continue taking upper-division writing requirements (such as ENGL A364: Editing and Publishing) and other upper-level Professional Writing courses. Year two is a good time to complete the foreign language requirement. Start work on a minor.

### Year Three

In the fall, complete at least one lower-division Survey Requirement (for example, ENGL A284 or ENGL A288) and at least one more upper-division major requirement (for example, a Major Authors course). Continue working on General Education requirements. In the spring, complete any remaining lower-division Survey Requirements and continue taking upper-division major requirements. Continue to make headway on the minor. Strongly consider taking ENGL A497: Directed Internship.

#### **Year Four**

In either the fall or the spring, complete the Senior Thesis (ENGL A496) and at least one more upper-division major requirement. Fill the remainder of your schedule with minor courses and any remaining general education courses. In the spring complete any remaining upper-division major requirements and all remaining minor and General Education requirements. Strongly consider taking ENGL A497: Directed Internship.
